

Do not get involved in criminal activities!

About the cards you have

Cash cards, cell phones, student ID cards, etc.

Do not sell, give, or lend it to others even if it is your own.

Do not buy, receive, or borrow it from others.



You should never possess, buy, make, or use a forged residence card.

Even if you see posts on SNS that forged residence cards are being sold or can be made, do not buy one.



About part-time job

If you have a part-time jobs that pays well for an easy job, you may be part of a criminal group without even knowing it.

Some of the part-time jobs that you should not do are those that help people commit crimes such as fraud.

- “ Receiving packages from elderly people.”
- “ Taking packages from coin operated lockers.”
- “ Withdrawing money using someone else's cash card.”
- “ Receiving packages from someone else at someone else's apartment.”

These are crimes.



About Illegal Drugs

It is a crime to use or possess illegal drugs, and it is also a crime to give or receive them.

In addition, cigarettes and other items used in your home country may contain drugs that are illegal in Japan.

It is a crime to possess cigarettes or other items that contain illegal drugs, even if you say "I did not know" that they were illegal.



If you commit a crime in Japan ...



Arrest

You have come all the way to Japan, but you can't study or work and will be returned to your home country.



Deportation - Imprisonment - Fines

Many foreign students and technical intern trainees commit crimes because they were lured by the words like "You will get a good part-time job".

You should not easily accept offers like "You will get a good part-time job".

In Japan, you have to obey Japanese laws.

And be careful not to get involved in criminal activities by criminal groups!
